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The five key findings

- 1. The NWP offers high quality professional development that enables teachers to improve their classroom practices and to enhance their students' learning.
- 2. The NWP is a nation-wide network that enables local sites to serve a significant number of the nation's teachers each year.
- 3. The NWP recruits and develops ethnically diverse teacher leaders, who in turn work with students who are more ethnically diverse than American students overall.
- 4. The NWP makes cost-efficient use of Federal funds.
- 5. The NWP is a model infrastructure that enables local sites to grow continually in their capacity to serve ever larger numbers of teachers.




Changes in teaching practice


Higher NAEP scores

Practices fostered by NWP that correlate with NAEP achievement

- Student or teacher <u>defines an audience</u> for the writing. Students <u>plan</u> their writing.
- Students produce more than one draft.
- Students sometimes use a computer to write their draft.
- Teachers talk to students about their writing.
- Students discuss their writing with their family.
- Students' written work is saved in a portfolio.




Geographic Coverage: 7 in 10 teachers in the U.S. are within the service area of a local Writing Project site




Participation in Invitational Institutes


Every year 1 out of every 50 schools in the United States has a teacher participating in an invitational summer institute.




Summary

Diversity: Students of Color



Summary


The NWP's core leadership development program serves teachers and students of color in higher proportions than the national average. 4. The National Writing Project makes cost-efficient use of Federal funds.

For every \$1 of Federal funds, NWP sites leverage an average of \$4.60 in state and local dollars.




The Idea of Educational Infrastructure

- Infrastructure a permanent structure that lies beneath the visible surface that facilitates other functions and activities
 - Water system, electrical system, bridges, roads...
 - Creates connections where there are disjunctures
- The NWP is a national professional development infrastructure that supports a coherent set of local professional development activities


NWP is a national network of local sites that are all part of the same connected
